ACMA ties up with its Pakistani counterpart for trade facilitation

Mumbai: Auto Component Manufacturers Association of India (ACMA) has joined hands with its Pakistani counterpart which aims at exploring viability of working together on skill development in Pakistan as well as building supply chains through Wagah by road.

ACMA and Pakistan Association of Automotive Parts & Accessories Manufacturers (PAAPAM) signed an MoU in this regard last Friday during the visit of a delegation from ACMA, under its president and managing director of Rane TRW Steering Systems Ltd Harish Lakshman, to Pakistan, a release said here.

The visit was part of the Indian Council for Research on International Economic Relations (ICRIER) initiative on the normalisation of trade between the two countries, it said.

Usman Aslam Malik, Chairman PAAPAM, and chairman of Kortech Auto Industries led the PAAPAM side, the release said.

As part of the understanding, the two associations plan to meet at least twice a year to facilitate business dialogue and people-to-people contact, ACMA said in the release.

ACMA exploring Joint venture with Pakistan

The meeting of the foreign secretaries of India and Pakistan may have been cancelled, but trade relations continued with a delegation of the Auto Component Manufacturers Association of India (ACMA), the apex body representing the interest of the Rs.2,11,765 crore Indian Auto Component Industry, signing an MoU with the Pakistan Association of Automotive Parts and Accessories Manufacturers (PAAPAM) in Lahore last week.

The MoU was signed as part of ICRIER's (Indian Council for Research on International Economic Relations) initiative on India-Pakistan trade normalisation.

"It's a humble beginning," Vinnie Mehta, director general of Acma told this newspaper, "but we agreed to identify middle and long term strategies where Indian companies handhold Pakistan companies.

Their volumes are small so their products are double the cost of Indian products."

India has a three million passenger vehicle market whilst Pakistan has a 1.2 lakh market. The volumes of two-wheelers in India is 16 million compared to Pakistan's 1.6mn
