24. Significant Accounting Polices for the year ended March 31, 2017.

Company Overview

Telematics 4U Services Private Limited ("Company") was incorporated as Private Limited Company on 26th March,2009 vide CIN: U72900KA2009PTC049462 having its registered office at Plot No.# 9, 2nd Floor, 1st Main Road, New BEL Road, Sanjaynagar, Bangalore-560094, Karnataka,India.

Company is in the business of designing and developing, promoting and marketing telematics, vehicle intelligence, remote monitoring related products and services globally.

Significant Accounting Policies:

i. Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention, on the accrual basis of accounting and in accordance with the accounting standards specified in section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013. The company follows accounting policies consistently in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, other than those specifically stated.

- a) The financial statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles in India (Indian GAAP) to comply with the Accounting Standards notified under section 133 of Companies Act 2013.
- b) The financial statements are prepared under the historical costs convention, on the accounting principles of a going concern.
- c) Accounting Policies not specifically referred to otherwise are consistent and in consonance with the applicable accounting standards prescribed by the Companies Act 2013 under section 133.
- d) All expenses and income to the extent ascertainable with reasonable certainty are accounted for on accrual basis.
- e) The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP) requires the management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and the disclosures of contingent liabilities on the date of financial statements and reported amounts of revenue and expenses for that year. Actual result could differ from these estimates. Any revision to accounting estimates is recognized prospectively.
- f) All assets and liabilities have been classified as current and non-current as per the company's normal operating cycle and other criteria set out in the schedule III to the companies Act, 2013. Based on the nature of products and the time between the acquisition of assets for processing and their realization in cash and cash equivalents, the company has ascertained its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of current/non-current classification of assets and liabilities.





if. Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognized when it is earned and no significant uncertainty exists as to its realization and collection. Sales are recognized, net of returns and trade discounts, on transfer of significant risks and rewards of ownership to the buyer, which generally coincides with the delivery of goods to customers. Sales excludes value added tax.

The Subscription charges, Partner Empowerment Fees, Software services upon completion of assignment and on services as per the mutually accepted terms and conditions in line with contracts/agreements with the customer. The Service income shall also be construed as completed upon the fulfillment of desired obligations on both the parties to the agreement, with no uncertainty regarding the consideration to be received on the services and it is shown excluding service taxes.

Other Income:

Interest income is accounted on accrual basis. Sundry creditors balances which are not payable and Sundry debtors balances which are showing credit balances i.e excess money received and not payable are transferred to other income. Management is the view that these are not payable due to non-fulfillment of conditions as per PO/agreement, hence transferred to other income.

iii. Foreign Currency Transactions:

Initial recognition:

Transactions in foreign currencies entered into by the Company are accounted at the exchange rates prevailing on the date of the transaction or at rates that closely approximate the rate at the date of the transaction.

Measurement of foreign currency monetary items at the Balance Sheet date

Foreign currency monetary items (other than derivative contracts) of the Company and its net investment in non-integral foreign operations outstanding at the Balance Sheet date are restated at the year-end rates.

Treatment of exchange differences

Exchange differences arising on settlement / restatement of short-term foreign currency monetary assets and liabilities of the Company are recognized as income or expense in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

iv. Inventories

Inventories of traded goods are valued at the lower of cost on FIFO basis and the net realizable value after providing for obsolescence and other losses, where considered necessary. Cost includes all charges in bringing the goods to the point of sale, including octroi and other levies, transit insurance and receiving charges.





V. Tangible Assets, Intangible Assets and Work -in - Progress

a) Tangible Assets -

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment lost.

i. The cost (Gross Block) of the Fixed asset is shown at the original cost of acquisition or construction, including taxes and duties (net of tax credits as applicable), interest on borrowing upto the period of time the Asset is put to use, and other incidental expenses relating to the acquisition and installation of the particular asset.

b) Intangible Assets -

The intangible assets are carried at cost less accumulated amortization and impairment losses, if any. The cost of an intangible asset comprises its purchase price, cost of development in relates to self-generated assets and any directly attributable expenditure on marketing the asset ready for its intended use. Intangible asset is an identifiable non-monetary asset, without physical substance, held for use in the delivery of services. Useful life is period over which an asset is expected to be used for. During the year the Company has internally developed different vertical of software assets and which are capitalized after the same are ready to use. During the year company has identified/classified Rs 3,77,42,147/- asself-generated software asset which has been developed internally on various verticals. We have relied on the management representation with regard to technical aspects in capitalizing the above intangible assets. The life of the internally developed software is taken at 6 years as explained by the Company and the details are given below:

c) Capital Work-in-progress- Capital Working progress comprises the cost of fixed assets that are not yet ready for their intended use at the reporting date. An amount of Rs.32,81,588/- has been shown under intangible assets under development

vi. Investments

During the year 2015-16 the Company has invested 56,000 Equity shares of Rs.10/- each in Adwise Analytics Private Limited, it subsidiary company. AdWise Board has approved in the Board Meeting held on 24th August 2017, to sell/transfer the shares held by Telematics4u Services Private Limited to Mr. Pratap Hegde. Subsequently, 56,000 Shares of Rs.10 each are transferred from Telematics4u Services Private limited to Mr. Pratap C Hegde at the face value and thereby AdWise Analytics Services Private Limited ceases to be the subsidiary of Telematics4u Services Private Limited.

yii. Depreciation

Schedule II to the Companies Act 2013, requires systematic allocation of the depreciable amount on an asset over its useful life. The Depreciable amount of an Asset is the cost of the asset or other amount substituted for cost less its residual value. The Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA) vide its notification dated 2-3-2014 has appointed 01-04-2014 as the date from which Schedule II comes into force. The Company has adopted useful life for various categories of Assets as specified in Part C of Schedule II of the Act. Part C of Schedule II also specifies that the residual value should be taken at not more than 5 % of the cost of the Asset.

Retirement/Disposal:

As a matter of consistent policy adopted by the company in respect of assets which are no more in existence or ceased to exist, the same have been discarded from the fixed assets. Further in cases where the depreciation on the assets have been fully written off, the residual value of 5% or the value continued in the books are carried forward without applying further depreciation on the same.

Addition to fixed assets:

Where asset value is less than Rs. 5000/- the same is treated as revenue expenditure.

Addition/Disposal of an asset:

In case of Addition/sale of asset including assets discarded,demolished or destroyed during the financial year, the depreciation on such asset shall be calculated on a prorata basis from the date of such addition or as the case maybe up to the date such asset has been sold, discarded, demolished or destroyed.

Method of Depreciation:

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SLM method of depreciation is followed as per Companies Act, 2013.

viii. Research and Development

Revenue expenditure incurred for new product development is expensed till technical and commercial feasibility is established and thereafter is capitalized as intangible assets. The management exercises business prudence and judgment on registration of patents with respect to the intangible assets.

Intangible assets are amortized over the estimated economic beneficial life. Management estimates the economic beneficial life of intangible assets between 1 to 6 years. Capital expenditure is shown as addition to fixed assets.

ix. Employee Benefits

a) Short Term Employee Benefits

The employee benefits payable only within 12 months of rendering the services are classified as short-term employee benefits. Benefits such as salaries, Leave Travel Allowance, short term compensated absences etc., and the expected cost of bonus is recognized in the period in which the employee renders the related services.

Employee benefits include compensated absences and performance incentives.

b) Post-Employment Benefits

Defined contribution plans

The Company's contribution to provident fund is considered as defined contribution plans and is charged as an expense as they fall due based on the amount of contribution required to be made.

Short-term employee benefits

The undiscounted amount of short-term employee benefits expected to be paid in exchange for the services rendered by employees are recognized during the year when the employees render the service.

Long-term employee benefits

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Bangalore INDIA

Compensated absences which are not expected to occur within twelve months after the end of the period in which the employee renders the related service are recognized as a liability.

The provisions of the 'Payment of Gratuity Act' are applicable to the company and accordingly actuarial valuation has been undertaken. It is the policy of the company to determine the liability as per valuation certificate issued by the actuary. Accordingly, the valuation certificate furnished by the actuary for the year ended 2017 amounts to Rs.13,21,963/- and treated accordingly in the financial statements.

x. Borrowing Cost

Borrowing costs include interest, amortization of ancillary costs incurred and exchange differences arising from foreign currency borrowings to the extent they are regarded as an adjustment to the interest cost. Costs relating to the borrowing of funds to the extent not directly related to the acquisition of qualifying assets are charged to the Statement of Profit and Loss over the tenure of the loan. Borrowing costs, allocated to and utilized for qualifying assets, pertaining to the period from commencement of activities relating to construction / development of the qualifying asset up to the date of Capitalization of such asset is added to the cost of the assets. As para 46A of AS 11 is followed by the company capitalization of borrowing cost in case of foreign currency monetary items does not arise as per notification of number 696/2011.

xi. Leases

There is no finance lease and there are four operating leases involving rental accommodation.

xii. Earnings per Share

Basic earnings per share is computed by dividing the profit / (loss) after tax (including the post-tax effect of extraordinary items, if any) by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year.

Diluted earnings per share is computed by dividing the profit / (loss) after tax (including the post-tax effect of extraordinary items, if any) as adjusted for dividend, interest and other charges to expense or income relating to the dilutive potential equity shares, by the weighted average number of equity shares considered for deriving basic earnings per share and the weighted average number of equity shares which could have been issued on the conversion of all dilutive potential equity shares.

xiii. Income Tax

Current income tax is not provided, since the Company has incurred cash loss during year under Audit.

Minimum Alternate Tax (MAT) is also not provided, since the company has not earned any book profit.

Deferred tax is recognized on timing differences, being the differences between the taxable income and the accounting income that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods. Deferred tax is measured using the tax rates and the tax laws enacted or substantially enacted as at the reporting date. Deferred tax liabilities are recognized for all timing differences.

Deferred tax assets in respect of unabsorbed depreciation and carry forward of losses are recognized only if there is virtual certainty that there will be sufficient future taxable income available to realize such assets. Deferred tax assets are recognized for timing differences of other items only to the extent that reasonable certainty exists that sufficient



future taxable income will be available against which these can be realized. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are offset if such items relate to taxes on income levied by the same governing tax laws and the Company has a legally enforceable right for such set off. Deferred tax assets are reviewed at each Balance Sheet date.

xiv. Impairment of Assets

The carrying values of assets / cash generating units at each Balance Sheet date are reviewed for impairment. If any indication of impairment exists, the recoverable amount of such assets is estimated and impairment is recognized, if the carrying amount of these assets exceeds their recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the greater of the net selling price and their value in use. Value in use is arrived at by discounting the future cash flows to their present value based on an appropriate discount factor. When there is indication that an impairment loss recognized for an asset in earlier accounting periods no longer exists or may have decreased, such reversal of impairment loss is recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss, except in case of revalued assets. During the year self-generated software assets of Rs.15,00,179/- has been discarded.

xv. Provisions and Contingent Liabilities

A. Provisions

Provision is recognized when the company has present obligations because of past event, it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligations and reliable estimate can be made of amount of the obligation. Provisions are not discounted at their present value and are determined based on the best estimate required to settle the obligation at the reporting date. These estimates are reviewed at each reporting date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.

B. Contingent Liabilities

Contingent liability is a possible obligation that arises from the past events whose existence will be confirmed by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events beyond the control of the company or a present obligation that is not recognized because it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation. A contingent liability also arises in extremely rare cases where there is liability that cannot be recognized because it cannot be measured reliably. The company does not recognize a contingent liability but discloses its existence in the financial statements.

xvi. Cash and cash equivalents

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Cash comprises cash on hand and demand deposits with banks. Cash equivalents are short-term balances (with an original maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition), highly liquid investments that are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and which are subject to insignificant risk of changes in value.

xvii. Service tax input credit

Service tax input credit is accounted for in the books in the period in which the underlying service received is accounted and when there is no uncertainty in availing / utilizing the credits.

As per the SHA with them entered by the company, it was agreed to give an exit to them through their OCPS redemption as per the terms given below:

- 2.0 times of OCPS amount if redeemed after 2 years and on / before 31.12.2015

KITVEN further reserves the right to redeem the OCPS at 20% IRR from the date of investment till the date of disinvestment after 31.12.2015.

However, it was mutually agreed between Telematics and KITVEN to redeem the OCPS @ Rs.653.50 Lakhs. The premium amount of Rs.4,04,50,000.00 has been reduced from Reserves and Surplus and shown as current liability.
